STATE OF ALABAMA JEFFERSON COUNTY CITY OF CLAY

A Resolution Authorizing the Mayor to Enter Into a Facilities Use Agreement with Jefferson County Board of Education

WHEREAS, the City of Clay has determined a need for use of athletic and event facilities; and,

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Board of Education desires to install artificial turf on the Clay Chalkville High School football field; and,

WHEREAS, artificial turf installation is a costly project for which the Jefferson County Board of Education has requested financial assistance; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Clay wishes to foster an amiable relationship with the local schools.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Clay that the Mayor is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Jefferson County Board of Education in which the City will provide up to \$265,000.00 for turf replacement on the Clay Chalkville High School football field and the Jefferson County Board of Education will allow the use of local school facilities by the City of Clay for 15 years; and,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor is authorized to sign the agreement in the name of the municipality, with the City Manager's attestation to the Mayor's signature.
